## EVALUATION OF EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONSE FIRST AID AND CPR COURSE

Dear Mr. Robinson:

We have evaluated your Emergency First Response First Aid and CPR Course Training Material as requested in your September 9, 2005 letter.

To conduct the evaluation, we used the OSHA Instruction CPL 2-2.53 - Subject: Guidelines for First Aid Programs (01-07-1991). Your materials exceed the requirements established by the OSHA Directive. Also, we saw the DVD for the interactive demonstration on situation, and it is very practical for learning and teaching purposes.

In addition, the recertification for your company is every two years. In the American Red Cross, the CPR recertification is on an annual basis, and the first aid is every three years.

The Puerto Rico Occupational Safety and Health Administration (PR OSHA) does not teach or certify first aid training programs, instructors or trainees.

Also, you can send or contact the related agencies such as: Fire Department, the Police Department and the local emergency management and response agency.
