It is my pleasure to inform you that the Emergency First Response Corporation's program submissions to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) for Emergency First Responder Primary Care (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) and Secondary Care (First Aid) courses have been approved effective November 17, 2006 under the California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 9, Chapter 1.5, First Aid Standards for Public Safety Personnel.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Authority staff have completed a thorough review of these program materials and have found them to meet or exceed the requirements of current regulations.
